What do reflexive verbs describe?	<i>describe actions done to or for oneself</i>
In Spanish, what is used with all reflexive verbs ?	<i>reflexive pronouns, end in -self or -selves and show that the subject both does and receives the action of the verb</i>
Where does the reflexive pronoun go when you have an infinitive form of the verb?	<i>the pronoun attaches to the end</i>
Where does the reflexive pronoun go when you conjugate a reflexive verb?	<i>the pronoun appears right before the conjugated verb</i>

HOW TO CONJUGATE REFLEXIVE VERBS:

Modelo: bañarse - to take a bath (to bathe oneself)

<i>personal pronoun</i>	<i>reflexive pronoun</i>	<i>reflexive verb</i>	<i>personal pronoun</i>	<i>reflexive pronoun</i>	<i>reflexive verb</i>
yo	me	baño	nosotros/as	nos	bañamos
tú	te	bañas	vosotros/as	os	bañáis
usted, él, ella	se	baña	ustedes, ellos/as	se	bañan

When a reflexive verb follows a conjugated verb , where can the reflexive pronoun go?	<p>1. <u>the reflexive pronoun can be attached to the infinitive verb</u> Quiero despertarme a las siete.</p> <p>2. <u>the reflexive pronoun can be placed directly before the FIRST conjugated verb</u> Me quiero despertar a las siete.</p>
<p>REFLEXIVO - ¿Sí o No? What is the difference in the following sentences? Which is reflexive?</p> <p>1. Yo despierto a Celia a las siete. 2. Yo me despierto a las siete.</p>	<p>1. <u>not reflexive.</u> "I wake up Celia at 7"</p> <p>2. <u>reflexive.</u> "I wake myself up at 7"</p>
